FLU IN THE NEWS

The 2017-2018 flu season is well under way and may prove to be challenging. With the CDC bracing for a potentially miserable fall and winter due in part to the Southern Hemisphere, the following articles are relevant to the cause:

2016-2017 FLU VACCINATION COVERAGE DATA

In late September, the *CDC released the 2016-2017 Flu vaccination coverage for the U.S.* (click preceding link for complete data).

Key messages: Flu vaccination among the general population and specific groups, including pregnant women and healthcare personnel, remains relatively stable. However, vaccination coverage remains low among some groups despite ample vaccine supply and new vaccination options in recent years.

General population: Flu vaccination among the US population remained stable from last year

- Flu vaccination among children remained steady (59%) despite the recommendation not to use the nasal flu vaccine.
- Similar to the 2015-16 season, children 13-17 years had the lowest flu vaccination coverage (49%) while children 6-23 months had the highest (76%).
- Last season, flu vaccination increased among adults overall. Uptake increased by nearly 2 percentage points among adults 50 years of age and older compared 2015-16.

Pregnant women: Flu vaccination among pregnant women remains unchanged since last year.

- However, we've maintained the gains made among this population since the 2009 influenza pandemic.
- We continue to see that pregnant women whose healthcare providers recommend and offer vaccination have the highest vaccination coverage.

Healthcare professionals: Flu vaccination among healthcare professionals remained high overall for the last 3 seasons. However, fewer than 70% of assistants and aides were vaccinated, while coverage was over 90% for physicians, PAs, nurses, nurse practitioners, and pharmacists.

- All hospital health care personnel have at least 90% vaccination coverage.
- When employers had on-site vaccination clinics for more than one day, 4 out of 5 health care personnel took advantage of the opportunity to get vaccinated, even in the absence of a vaccination requirement.


The current rankings are on the following page.
